

## Public Sexual Harassment

Education & Training for Staff and Students

Our Streets Now is founded on a very simple principle: we believe that everyone deserves to feel safe and be safe in public space. Right now, this goal couldn't be further from the truth.



66% of girls in the UK have been sexually harassed in public

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1 in 8 girls have their first experience of sexual harassment before the age of 11

42% of girls don't tell anyone when they are sexually

harassed

76% of pupils don't feel confident talking to their teachers about sexual harassment

Our vision is for every young person to be taught about public sexual harassment (PSH), its root causes and its impacts in school. We provide free ready-made lesson plans and other resources for teachers to use to talk about PSH in the classroom. But, many teachers tell us they feel under-equipped to engage pupils of all genders or to answer difficult questions, while young people feel uncomfortable challenging harmful behaviour and ashamed when discussing their own experiences.

This is why we are offering staff training and a range of age-appropriate student workshops to equip schools and colleges with the knowledge and skills to tackle public sexual harassment. ## Why Our Streets Now

## Youth-centred

Our team has spent years researching public sexual harassment, talking to young people about their experiences and understanding the complex barriers that exist for schools and colleges aiming to make change. We talk to young people using real experiences they can relate to and we give staff an insight into the issues their learners are likely facing.

## Bespoke & flexible

We understand the constraints of the school timetable and can adjust our session timings and content to suit your needs. We also have a flexible pricing system to fit your budget, so please talk to us if cost is an issue.

## **Expert facilitators**

Our delivery team is made up of diverse, experienced and qualified facilitators, from former secondary school teachers to consent and RSE experts and educators. All staff are fully DBS-checked and are trained in safeguarding and handling sensitive content.





We work with students from year 9 upwards in workshops which aim to create a safe space for students to read experiences of sexual harassment, define what it means to them, explore its impacts and question their own biases and assumptions. At the end of each workshop we aim for all students to have an improved understanding of harassment and how to challenge it in their communities.

The workshop timings can flex from 50-90 minutes and can accommodate up to 30 students in each one, delivered by 2 facilitators. We can work with an entire year group running one workshop after another one, or running up to three simultaneous workshops.

We offer two slightly different workshops for different age groups: Understanding Sexual Harassment and Cultures of Sexual Harassment.



## Year 9-11 Workshop: Understanding Sexual Harassment

#### **Content includes:**

- Defining what constitutes public sexual harassment
- Understanding the impacts of harassment and why it is always wrong
- Being an active bystander and how to challenge your peers



Sixth Form and Further Education Workshop: Cultures of Sexual Harassment

#### **Content includes:**

- Challenging the stigma and silence around public sexual harassment
- Understanding that harassment is part of a wider harmful culture of gender inequality
- The intersections of gender inequality with racism and homophobia
- How individuals and communities can tackle harassment

We can offer the sixth form workshop to years 10-11 if they have already had our Understanding Sexual Harassment session.






Our staff sessions are designed to increase confidence from teaching staff in understanding, responding to and preventing public sexual harassment. We also provide free resources, including ready-made lesson plans, and training on how to use them.

We can deliver sessions for any number of teaching staff and can keep the content general for a whole staff session or tailored, e.g. to focus on safeguarding procedures for a pastoral team training.

We have up to 4.5 hours worth of training content, so when you book, please specify how long you would like your session to be and the content that you would like to be prioritised. Our minimum session length is 1 hour

he Changemaker Programme is for schools and colleges who want student ambassadors to lead on making change. We facilitate this happening by delivering a workshop, or series of workshops, to a group of pupils from year 10 upwards. In the workshop, they explore issues relating to public sexual harassment, learn key changemaking skills and at the end, they present their ideas for change in school to senior leadership staff.

We work hard to create a safe space, which is why we don't work with a whole year group, but instead a smaller segment of the school that are interested or affected by these issues. We can deliver this workshop

- A student council or a body of student leaders
- A feminist society
- All the girls and non-binary students from one year group or class
- ~ A group of self-selected students as an extra-curricular activity

## **Session Costs**

We are a registered social enterprise and we aim to keep the session costs as low as we can, only charging schools and colleges what it costs us to run them. If budget is an issue for you, please let us know as there may be funding available to subsidise it.

The exact cost will depend on how long the workshops will run and the estimated travel costs but here is a rough guide to how we price our sessions. The most cost effective option is for our team to run multiple sessions on the same day. A team of 4 facilitators means we can run 2 workshops simultaneously.
